Relationships and Positive Behaviour at Tollcross Primary

At Tollcross Primary building positive relationships is central to supporting our learners to make good behaviour choices in the classroom and in the playground. We have a warm and trusting school ethos aimed at developing positive relationships with all of our learners. We recognise positive behaviour and support pupils to use positive behaviour strategies in the classroom and in the playground.

We work in partnership with parents and learners to ensure that all learners feel included, involved and engaged at school.

Our school rules have been co-created with our learners and are aimed at influencing positive behaviour and building effective relationships across our school community. We have identified three school rules that encourage us to be **safe**, **respectful** and **kind** to others.

At Tollcross Primary we aim to:

- ensure policies and procedures are followed
- work in partnership with parents and carers to build relationships and support learners
- develop a culture and ethos which promotes positive, trusting relationships across our school community
- promote, amongst staff, an understanding of how to positively influence and de-escalate behaviours and support learners to manage their behaviour in school
- support the individual needs of children and young people with additional support needs
- facilitate and listen to the views of children and young people
- emphasise rights, respect and responsibilities
- identify and address any barriers to learning
- develop effective leadership and management at all levels
- actively support staff to access continuous professional development opportunities
- address challenging behaviour including bullying
- use a variety of supports within and outwith the establishment to support children and young people
- monitor, evaluate and improve practice

At Tollcross Primary we follow all Council and National policies to support pupils and parents to access and receive the best education they can. Ensuring good behaviour allows us to offer pupils the best possible opportunity to access learning, build positive relationships and achieve their full potential.

Better Behaviour Better Learning

At the beginning of each school year every class creates their own Class Charter and displays the rights that all members of the class have agreed on to make their year successful, supportive and happy.

At Tollcross we encourage learners to follow our school rules and develop positive relationships with others. All classes promote positive behaviour and use praise, encouragement and recognition to support learners to make good behaviour choices.

All classes follow our school positive behaviour strategies to ensure continuity across our school. We aim to support all learners to build effective relationships and make good behaviour choices.

Positive Behaviour Strategies - Classroom

- I. Clear instruction given to pupil
- 2. Reminder of instruction
- 3. Thinking time in class
- 4. Thinking time out of class with restorative conversation
- 5. Inform SLT
- 6. Conversation with parent/carer

Positive Behaviour Strategies - Playground

- I. Clear instruction given
- 2. Time to reflect on behaviour
- 3. Restorative conversation, identifying the behaviour we want to see
- 4. Inform SLT
- 5. Appropriate adult has a conversation with parent/carer

Communicating with Learners

- Listen
- Use of Emotion Talks strategies to identify feelings and emotions
- Respond empathically recognise the emotions that the child has by naming them
- Tell them that it's ok to have these feelings
- Let them know specifically what behaviour is unacceptable link to Tollcross Big 3
- Tell them that you want to hear what they have to say "Help me to understand what you're saying to me."
- Use problem-solving skills "What would help right now?" (This might only be possible once they have started to calm down)
- Offer praise where you can "Well done! You're making good choices. Keep on taking deep breaths."
- Set limits offer choices and communicate clearly
- Always show warmth and positive regard
- Be consistent and predictable
- Be firm but fair

Resources to Support Individual Learners

Emotions Talk

Emotions Talk has been developed by the City of Edinburgh Children and Families Department. It offers staff a staged framework that supports children to develop the skills required to recognise and talk about their own and others' emotions.

Social Stories

Originally devised for children with Autism, *Social Stories* are personalised stories which support children to make sense of their daily experiences. They are often used to support children with situations they find challenging – playtime, school outings, the start of the week, the end of the week. Social stories reinforce acceptable or desirable behaviour and help the child to understand why things happen the way they do.
